

Christmas Ornament Instructions

Supplies

Spellbinders Grand Calibur

Spellbinders Die Templates SG 249 Big Scalloped Circles LG

S4 324 Ribbon Banners

S4 340 Create-a-Flake Three

My Mind's Eye Stella & Rose Mabel "Play" Damask Printed papers

White Chipboard

ScorPal paper scorer

Color Box Chestnut Roan ink

Ranger Distress Walnut Stain and Tumbled Glass ink

Want 2 Scrap Adhesive jewels

Scrapbook Adhesives 3D Foam Squares

Studio G mini alphabet stamps

Ranger Glossy Accents

Glitter

Twine

Small hole punch



Instructions:

1. Die cut and emboss 20 scalloped circles that are equal in size from SG 249 Big Scalloped Circles, die template #2 was used for this one.
2. Ink the edges of all of the circles

3. Score a triangle on each circle. You want the three points of the triangle to touch the edge of the circle. With this particular template it works out that there is a triangle point between every four scallops.
4. Fold your paper up at all of your score lines.
5. Die cut and emboss snowflakes #1 and #2 from S4 340 Create-a-Flake and also a banner from S4 324 Ribbon Banners.
6. Ink the edges of all three pieces.
7. Apply Glossy Accents to tops of both snowflakes and sprinkle with glitter. Once dry, adhere small snowflake to the top of the larger one using foam adhesive. Punch hole on top of snowflake and thread with twine.
8. With banner piece still inside of die template, emboss the banner with aqua ink. Take banner out and stamp "let it snow" on it. Adhere jewels. Apply Glossy Accents to edges of banner and sprinkle with glitter.
9. Take 5 circles and glue them together to make a "top" cap by adhering them side by side so that their triangles all have a point at the top.
10. Take 5 more circles and make a "bottom" cap, make sure to hang snowflake through the center before completely closing the cap.
11. Make a "ring" from the remaining 10 circles by adhering them side by side, this time the points of the triangles need to alternate up and down.
12. Adhere the bottom cap to the middle ring, and then the top cap to the middle ring, making sure to thread the twine through the top of the cap piece before adhering all together.
13. Adhere banner to front of ornament.

***Designers note: I used small book binding clips to hold the pieces together as I went along. I used Glossy Accents to adhere it all as it dries very quickly and has a very strong bond
